Philadelphia Juneteenth Parade & Festival Leaders to Host Press Conference with Mayor Kenney

May 31, 2019 -- Philadelphia, PA -- In February 2019, the Philadelphia Juneteenth Parade and Festival announced its official partnership with the City of Philadelphia for its 4th annual parade taking place on Saturday, June 22, 2019. On Wednesday, June 5th at 12:30PM in the Mayor's Reception Room, City Hall, Mayor Jim Kenney will join leaders of this year's Philadelphia Juneteenth Parade and Festival at City Hall for a press conference announcing new additions to this year's Juneteenth celebrations. Mayor Kenney will stand alongside long-time supporter Councilwoman Jannie Blackwell and Juneteenth CEO Micheal Rashid and COO Ali Salahuddin to announce the exciting new additions to this year's parade.

"The City is proud to partner with the Philadelphia Juneteenth Parade and Festival" stated Mayor Kenney. "Juneteenth is an event that has a unique cultural and historical significance, both here in Philadelphia and across the country. We're really excited that the new parade route will take place in the heart of West Philadelphia. Philadelphia has long been known as a city of neighborhoods, so it's only appropriate that the parade takes place in one of our most vibrant and diverse communities. I hope that residents from all parts of the city will come out and enjoy this year's Juneteenth festivities."

Dating back to June 19, 1865, Juneteenth is the oldest celebration commemorating the ending of slavery in the United States. The Philadelphia Juneteenth Parade and Festival, produced by the Pennsylvania Juneteenth Initiative, is held annually and attended by thousands. The event joins people together to embrace African and African-American culture and history, and continue the tradition of higher education, self-empowerment and self-determination. On Saturday, June 22, 2019, the Fourth Annual Philadelphia Juneteenth Parade and Festival will commence at 52nd and Parkside Avenue, move south on 52nd Street and end with a festival at Malcolm X Park (52nd and Pine Streets), where the official renaming ceremony of 52nd Street to "Muhammad Ali Way" will take place.

On Saturday, June 22, more than 10,000 individuals will descend on West Philadelphia to celebrate the history of Juneteenth, watch the two-mile long cultural parade and enjoy a festival at Malcolm X Park where Kindred The Family Soul will not only perform, but also serve as Grand Marshal of this year's Parade.



Michael Rashid was appointed Chief Executive Officer of the Pennsylvania Juneteenth Initiative in late 2018. Mr. Rashid, an executive with the Centene Corporation (owner of PA Health and Wellness), and former CEO of Amerihealth Caritas, stated “We are excited to bring the Juneteenth celebration back for its 4th year and, this time, back to the community.” In previous years, the parade route has traveled through the historic district of Center City. “Bringing the parade to 52nd Street, a place where historically African-American businesses have thrived, was an important change we had to make to increase attendance and economically benefit community based businesses.”

Earlier this year, Mayor Kenney was named Honorary Chair of the 2019 Juneteenth Parade and Festival. Mayor James F. Kenney joins a number of notable Philadelphia leaders who have volunteered to serve on the 2019 Philadelphia Juneteenth Host Committee including, Councilwoman Jannie L. Blackwell; Councilman Curtis Jones; State Senators Vincent Hughes and Sharif Street; James Burnett, Executive Director of West Philadelphia Financial Services Institution; Romona Riscoe Benson, Director of PECO’s Corporate Relations; Sharmain Matlock-Turner, President & CEO of Urban Affairs Coalition; Atif Bostic, President of UpLift Solutions; Attorney Robert L.
